# Time for a change at the All Men's Club

When I first joined the SDTF 4 years ago, I noticed something missing. I asked myself, "Why don't we have any women members?" When I started asking others about it, many reacted with shrugs and indifference. Some commented, "There isn't any interest," or "we tried to get them to come out, but they won't play."

The question still remains unanswered. With a notable exception, there still aren't any women. The answer is difficult. It's almost as difficult to answer as the question, "Why doesn't anyone seem to care?"

## Finding answers

I set out to find the answer to the first question. Maybe everyone else can help me with the second.

I talked to a few selected women; Karen Alexander, a SDTF member since the 80's and currently our only woman member; Marion O'Connor, a resident of Spring Valley who played tennis in the Gay Games in the Netherlands; Wendy Murphy, former SDTF member and a current teaching pro at the Peninsula Tennis Club in Ocean Beach; and Roseann DeMartino, a very close friend and co-worker who was president of the San Diego Women's Tennis Network (WTN), a tennis group started in 1995 and ended in 1997.

After speaking to Karen, Marion, Wendy, and Roseann, I found that: 1) women are interested in participating in a lesbian and gay tennis group 2) a large group of women have played organized lesbian or gay tennis 3) a strategy to recruit women differs from that of men.

## WTN - San Diego

According to Roseann, about 100 women participated in the WTN. Wow! 100! Granted, only 30-40 participated regularly, but the total number is comparable to the SDTF. Bryan Lepree's latest report stated that we currently had 75 paying members, 50 unpaid, a total of 125 members.

The WTN membership fee was \$30, which helped pay for their newsletter, and several round robin and social events during the year. The group also participated in the San Diego Gay Pride Parade. One year, the WTN co-hosted a tournament together with SDTF. According to Roseann, the makeup of the group was 60% "C" and beginner players, with the rest being "A" and "B" level players.

They often played at Morley Field and other venues, but were unable to locate a place where they could all play together.

Roseann also said that the WTN ended due to a number of factors including: a) no common place to play; b) in general, women are "nesters," - once they find a partner, they tend to cut down on their playing or stop altogether; c) when Roseann got burned out, there was no one to take her place; and d) eventual lack of participation and interest.

## Playing with SDTF

Why haven't these women come out to play with the SDTF? In the past, some have. The women I talked to gave many different answers about why women aren't participating now.

Roseann said the principal reason has been intimidation. "Most of the women players who would go out were beginners. Maybe the men weren't trying to intimidate the women, but they did." Roseann said the women she knew who came out to participate with the SDTF never returned because they felt that they weren't wanted due to their playing level.

Marion O'Connor, a former member of the WTN, said that women need to be treated a little differently. "Women need a more structured event. Team Tennis or round robin doubles are good examples. Women need a more personal touch, like phone calls and making sure someone is available to welcome them." Roseann DeMartino agreed, adding that a social gathering prior to a mixed doubles tournament would be a good idea.

## Stump the Ump!

Certified United States Tennis Association umpire and SDTF member, Chris Clarke, challenges you to "stump" him with a tennis rules question. Every month Chris will take one of your questions and give you the "official" answer.



*"In the second receiving game of a set my doubles partner and I accidentally switched receiving positions. I know that you're supposed to keep to the same sides in doubles during a set and can change at the beginning of another. But is there a penalty when you accidentally change in the middle of a set?"*

In situations when mistakes are made during change of ends, serving or receiving, all points played in good faith stand! You are not required to award the opponents a game or points when the receiver's position was identified as incorrect. The Rules of Tennis are very clear about this. However, most people don't know what the rules are in a doubles match regarding order of serve and receive. In this case, you would resume your original positions the next time you receive. In tie breaks the rules are different and are more complicated.

### Rule 36. Order of Receiving In Doubles

The order of receiving the service shall be decided at the beginning of each set as follows:

The pair who have to receive the service in the first game shall decide which partner shall receive the first service, and that partner shall continue to receive the first serve in every odd game throughout the set. The opposing pair shall likewise decide which partner shall receive the first service in the second game and that partner shall continue to receive the first serve in every even game throughout the set. Partners shall receive the service alternately throughout each game.

*Case 1. Is it allowable in doubles for the Server's partner or the Receiver's partner to stand in a position that obstructs the view of the receiver?*

*Decision. Yes. The Server's partner or the Receiver's partner may take any position on his side of the net in or out of the Court that he wishes.*

### Rule 38. Error In Order Of Receiving In Doubles

If during a game the order of receiving the service is changed by the Receivers it shall remain as altered until the end of the game in which the mistake is discovered, but the partners shall resume their original order of receiving in the next game of that set in which they are Receivers of the service.

O'Connor said she lost interest in the SDTF when they eliminated the women's division/mixed doubles events in the Open. She and Roseann agree that there are a lot of women who want to participate in organized lesbian and gay tennis groups and tournaments. They both noted that "All Girls Tennis" in Los Angeles and a women's group in Palm Springs are good examples of women's interest. All the women I spoke with gave various reasons why they don't play with the Federation. Some thought we were more of a social club rather than a competitive tennis group. Others were too busy.

**Recruiting Women**

All said that whether they played or not, they would like to contribute to bringing more women out to play with SDTF. O'Connor said she regularly plays with four or five women who might be interested in participating. Wendy Murphy said she is willing to help out with getting the word out by e-mail to friends. Karen said she'll be coming out soon again. What can we do? The women I talked to suggested

a stronger advertising campaign. This includes advertisements in gay papers and local non-gay papers. They suggested distributing flyers at local establishments in Hillcrest, at bars where many women go such as Bourbon Street, The Flame, Club Bombay, Kickers. Flyers could also go to athletic groups, such as Athletes In Motion, women's rugby, softball, soccer, etc.

Roseann said the flyers should specifically state that women are welcome "no matter what their playing ability." She added that a specific person be available to welcome women.

**Board and membership involvement**

This is an opportune time for the new board of directors and their new spirit of cooperation and inclusiveness, to move forward with this. In fact, the board recently formed a committee to recruit more women.

But the board can't do it alone. Everyone needs to care. I encourage you to come up with ideas for recruiting and including women in the Federation. I challenge all of you to invite at least one woman friend out to play with us. Ask them to come out to Friday doubles Sunday social play, and to Jerry Sabio's tennis clinic on Saturdays.

With a concerted effort, we can have a strong women's presence. This, in turn, will make for a stronger SDTF.

## Members approve Webmaster board position

Members unanimously approved the San Diego Tennis Federation charter amendment adding the position of Webmaster to the SDTF Board. The board immediately acted upon the results and appointed Andre Lalias, SDTF's current Webmaster to the newly created position during the general meeting held Sunday, February 4.

In other actions, the board also formed a committee, to be chaired by Arthur Pugeda, President, to look into the issue of recruiting women to play with the Federation. The issue, initially raised during January's general meeting by Bruce Even, promoted several suggestions. After January's meeting, Bruce agreed to write an article outlining the concerns; his article appears in this month's newsletter. The committee will come up with recommendations and an action plan, and present it to the full board.

Pete Mayers, Social Chair, reported on his success in updating and placing notices in the three local gay and lesbian newspapers, Gay and Lesbian Times, Update, and Buzz. Ads include the SDTF website and Membership Chair Bryan Lepree's phone number.

Bryan also reported that he has received several suggestions for slogans he plans to incorporate into flyers. These flyers will be distributed throughout the community. His original slogan "He Bangs, She Bangs (tennis balls of course)" and based on a current pop song received the most interest. He is working with a SDTF member to create the flyers for board approval.

Daniel Lee, Ladder Chair, told the board that he is scrapping the current ladder and putting together a new one based on GLTA points, Grand Prix points, declared level. He is also revising ladder rules and will present the revised rules to the committee. After Daniel introduces his revised ladder, the club will initiate a two-week "scramble". After the scramble, regular ladder rules will apply. *Daniel's revised ladder appears below.*

Andre Lalias, Webmaster, agreed to write a set of criteria for creating a "Hall of Fame" for SDTF members who have made significant contributions to the development of the Federation. Induction into the Hall may also include privileges such as lifetime membership. A full discussion of benefits was tabled for the March meeting.

The board also discussed Greg Anthes proposal to initiate singles league play later in the year. Greg outlined the proposal in an article that appeared in February's newsletter. Greg and Secretary, Rancy Breece, and Rules Chair, Archie Lejarde will work together on a sub-committee that will refine the proposal and associated logistics and bring it to the full board for discussion.

San Diego Open XVI Co-chairs Jerry Sabio and Bruce Even reported on progress for the event to be held over the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday. *See article on page one for more details on the Open.*
